Absorption: well absorbed from the digestive tract; Distribution: mainly distributed to the liver with low concentrations in the brain, lungs, kidneys, spleen, heart. Metabolism: metabolism in the liver Removal: 40% diuretic within 5 d; 15% elimination in feces; Hours of evaluation and monitoring of drug effects for therapeutic efficacy due to a long half-life, therapeutic effect is slow to develop in early treatment or when the established drug regimen changes. The therapeutic window effect (the point at which the dose increases or concentrations actually reduce the therapeutic response) may occur after a long period of high doses. Close observation is necessary when the volume changes. Targeted symptoms are expected to be reduced with successful haloperidol treatments including hallucinations, insomnia, nausea, agitation, and illusion. Check the mental state of the patient every day. Neurotic cancer (NMS) (see Appendix F), especially in people with high blood pressure or lithium use. Symptoms of NMS can appear immediately after the start of treatment or after months or years of taking neuroleptic medication (antipsychotic) discontinued the use of the drug immediately if NMS suspected of monitoring Parkinson's disease and tardive dyskinesia (see Appendix F) the risk of tardive dyskinesia appears to be greater in women receiving high doses and in the elderly. It can occur after long-term treatment, and even after treatment is discontinued. Detect extrapyramidal (neuromuscular) reactions that occur frequently during the first few days of treatment. Symptoms are usually associated with dosage and are controlled by reducing doses or simultaneous administration of anti-Parkinson's drugs. Alertness for behavioral changes in patients receiving anti-Parkinson's drugs simultaneously Check for exacerbations of seizure activity. Closely observe the patient for rapid mood changes as well as depression when using haloperidol to control mania or Depression may indicate the effects of drugs or return from manic conditions. Laboratory tests: Monitor the number of WBC with differential functions and liver in patients for prolonged treatment. Study patients and families avoid alcohol use during treatment Do not drive or engage in other potentially dangerous activities until they are aware of the drug response. Discuss oral hygiene with healthcare providers Dry mouth may promote dental problems Drink enough water. Avoid excessive exposure to sunlight or sunlight and use sunscreen.
